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Two Day Faculty Development Programme organized by Vivekananda Institute of Human Excellence

A Report

A Two day Faculty Development Program was organized by VIHE, Ramakrishna Mutt for the faculty of Bhartiya Vidya Bhavan, Sainikpuri Kendra. Thirty two teachers from Bhavan's Ramakrishna Vidyalaya , Bhavan's Aurobindo Junior College and Bhavan's Vivekananda Fourteen lecturers from Bhavan's degree & PG College participated in the program. Vivekananda Degree & PG College participated in the FDP Program. (attended by - Mrs Meena Rani, Mrs M Anila, Dr Y Suresh, Mr TVLNH Prasad, Mrs S Vanita,

Ms Ankita Nagra, Mrs RAanuradha, Mrs P Rajni, Mrs K Swathi, Mrs T Sai Santoshi, Ms Sakshi Yadav, Mrs Chandrika P, Dr Sushma Patkar and Mrs Abhignya Banerjee.)

The main objective of the FDP was to train teachers to impart value education to students based on Bhartiya Sanskriti

The program started with a yoga session conducted by Mrs Zarna Mohan, a direct disciple of the yoga exponent BKS Iyengar. She gave an introduction on the principles of yoga and its practice.

The teachers proceeded to temple visit, to spend time on meditation and prayer.

Swamy Bodhmayanandji addressed the participants. He spoke about the sacrifices made by women, and their great contribution to society.

A short film on Sister Nivedita, a disciple of Swami Vivekananda was played for the audience. Sister Nivedita, absorbed the Indian values and wrote many books to spread the message of Hinduism and Indian philosophy.

Mr Veera Bhadrudu, Additional Director, Tribal Welfare, Telangana Government stressed the 4Cs of education - critical thinking, communication, creativity and collaboration.

Swamy Tathvarthananda - a monk associated with Ramkrishna Mutt for the past 11 years, defined education in the words of Swami Vivekananda as that which ennobles one's character, strengthens the mind, expands one's intellect and empowers the student's to stand on their own feet. He also spoke about the importance of Samskaras and Vasanas in the process of education.

Shri L Ravi Chander, Senior Advocate, AP and Telangana High Court discussed the importance of teaching moral and cultural values to our students He advised the teachers to bring the ancient wisdom and value system to students in a meaningful way by relating stories from our Puranas and rich folklore.

Post lunch

Mr Pramod Kumar, a student of IIT, Chennai, and faculty at Amrita Vidyalayam, Coimbatore, interacted with the teachers in a live skype session. He shared some of the best practices implemented in his institution in the form of compulsory course on Indian heritage and culture, elective courses on ethics of Ramayana and Mahabharata and also practical sessions on Yoga and Meditation. He also emphasised the need to celebrate our culture and festivals in educational institutions.

Day 2

The second day started with yoga session conducted by **Ms Zarna Mohan**. This was followed by temple visit.

Swami Tathvarthananda continued with his discourse on Samskara and Vasana and gave valuable tips on how to teach Sanskaras through trust, love and emotional balance through interesting examples..

Mrs Madhavi Lata, Chairperson, Virenchy Hospitals gave a thought provoking lecture on motherhood, and the changing role of women in modern society. She also discussed at length, the stress and challenges faced by women to balance their job and responsibilities at home.

Dr Shravan Kumar, Director and Principal, New Era Junior College shared his experience from his teaching career and discussed the various challenges faced by teachers in the classroom situations. He also emphasized that teachers and parents have a major role to play in the process of character building of students.

Concluding session

Swamy Bodhmayanandji invited the participants to express their impressions of the two day FDP program and also discussed the future course of action. The teachers suggested various interesting activities in the form of rhymes, story telling, skits and role play to teach moral and cultural values.

- 1) Can introduce elective courses on Indian culture and values, Yoga & meditation,
- 2) To plan activities during college fests and cultural festivals.

FDP RE PORT OF 2017

Department of Languages organized Faculty Development Program(FDP) 2017. The program was scheduled for 2 days - 2/6/17 and 3/6/17 respectively. The venue for Day 1, was the Seminar Hall in the MBA block. The program started at 10:00am with the Bhavan's prayer after which the principal Prof. Y. Ashok welcomed the faculty and the speakers for the day. There were four speakers invited for four sessions on different topics.

The speaker for the first session was Prof. Pannala Ramaiah (K.U) who spoke on 'Quality in higher education perspective – NAAC. He explained in detail on enhancing the quality of higher education through the perspective of NAAC. The speaker for the second session was Prof. Ramabramham (HCU). He spoke on MOOCs. He gave a detailed explanation about MOOCs, its availability of the online course and its utility in the students' fraternity. After both the sessions there was a break for lunch. The Faculty development Program on the 3rd of June 2017 was a one day program at Rama Krishna Math. The faculty was to report by 9:30 a.m at Rama Krishna Math. It started with the breakfast at 10:00 a.m after which we had a session led by Swami Bhodmayanandji. He spoke about the 'Need for the spiritual consciousness through meditation, to have a control over our minds which will enhance the teaching – learning process.' After that we had the second session, where the faculty was divided into two groups and there were two sessions held

A report on FDP 2nd June 2017

Dr.Y. Aparna faculty member from the Department of Microbiology compered the programme. With the blessings of the almighty the program started.

Prof Y Ashok – Principal, BVC welcomed the gathering. He congratulated both the faculty and the students for the results. He discussed in brief on the status of the autonomy of the college. He motivated all the faculty to be vigilant and ready to face the challenges. He gave an insight into the teacher—student relationship.

Dr. Y. Aparna welcomed the eminent speaker Dr. Pannala Ramaiah with an inspiring sloka.

Dr. Pannala Ramaiah - spoke on the topic - `Quality in Higher Education – perspective – NAAC.

He opined that knowledge can be acquired in three ways: one should be a voracious reader, should be a good observer, be a good traveler. He recollected that in 1993, a three member committee for NAAC was appointed and he was one of the nominees. NAAC was established in the year 1994. He differentiated between the terms assessment and accreditation.

In depth he spoke about the different Stages of Assessment : Sustainable Stage, Competitive Stage, Innovative Stage, Quality Stage (Premiere Stage)

He also categorized the Premiere Institutions as - Institutions of National Importance and Institutions of International Institutions. Quantity (Increased Access), Quality (Relevance and Excellence) are the reasons for accreditation.

He also said that there are seven steps in quality:

Q – Quest for excellence

- U Understanding
- A Action-oriented
- L Learner Centric
- I Innovation
- T Training
- Y Yearly Progression

A good teacher engages in Teaching, Research and Extension. The best practice of an institution is to internalize and institutionalize.

He also gave a detailed insight of the Seven Criteria of Assessment and Accreditation: Curricular aspect, Curriculum design and development, Curriculum planning and assessment, Feedback system, Student profile, Evaluation process, Research consultation and publication. He said that the institution should have facilities which are - Innovational, Institutional, Identification, Internalize, Designates and also should have definite question which pose the strengths and weaknesses of the institution.
