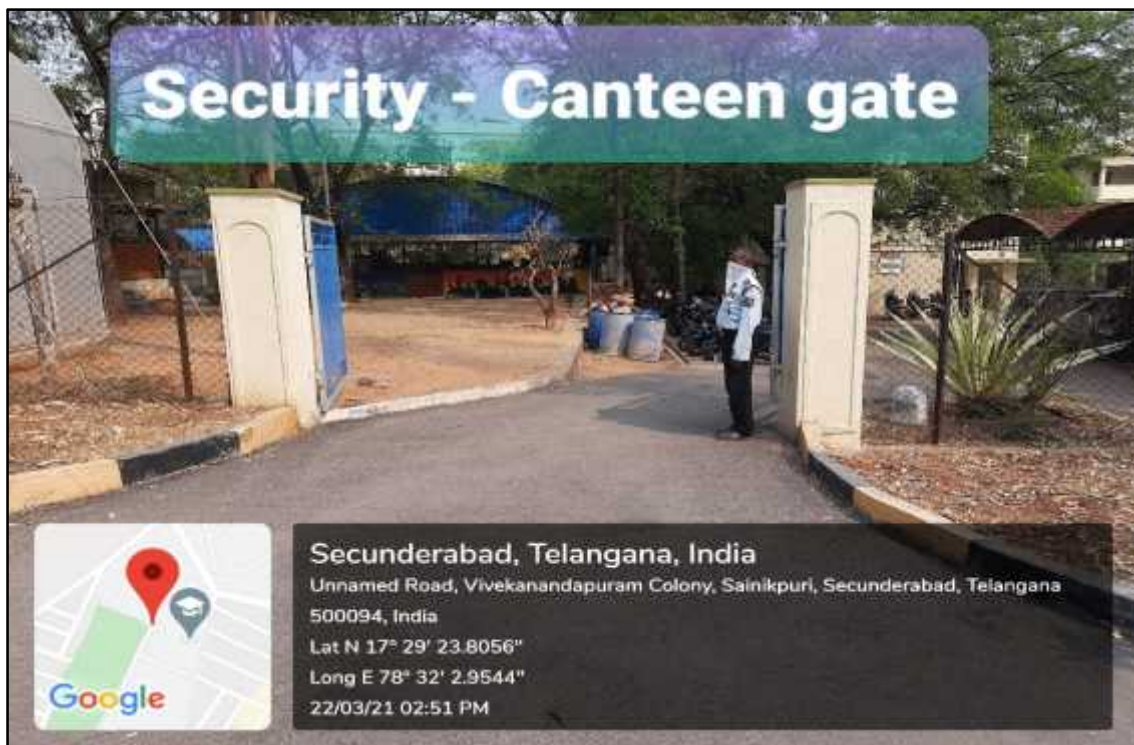
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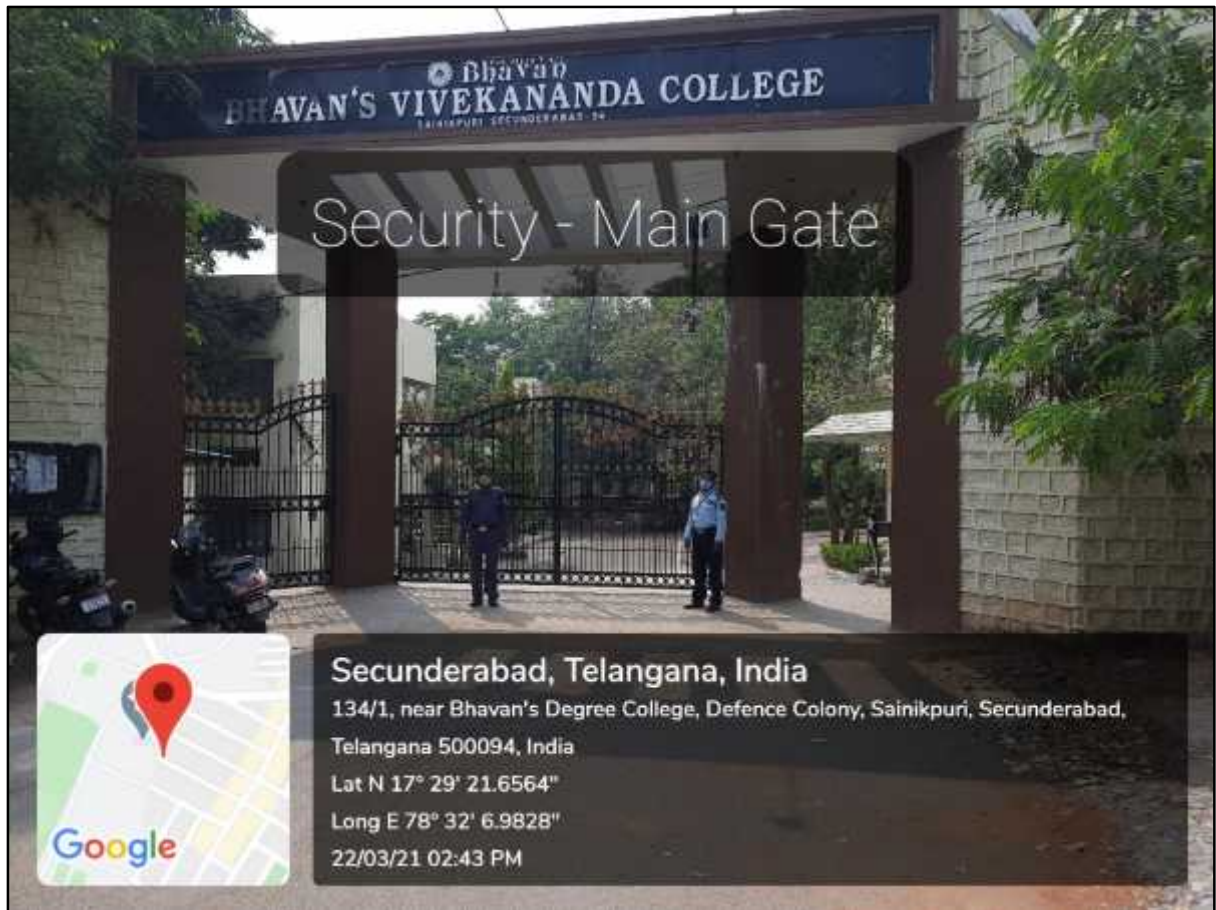

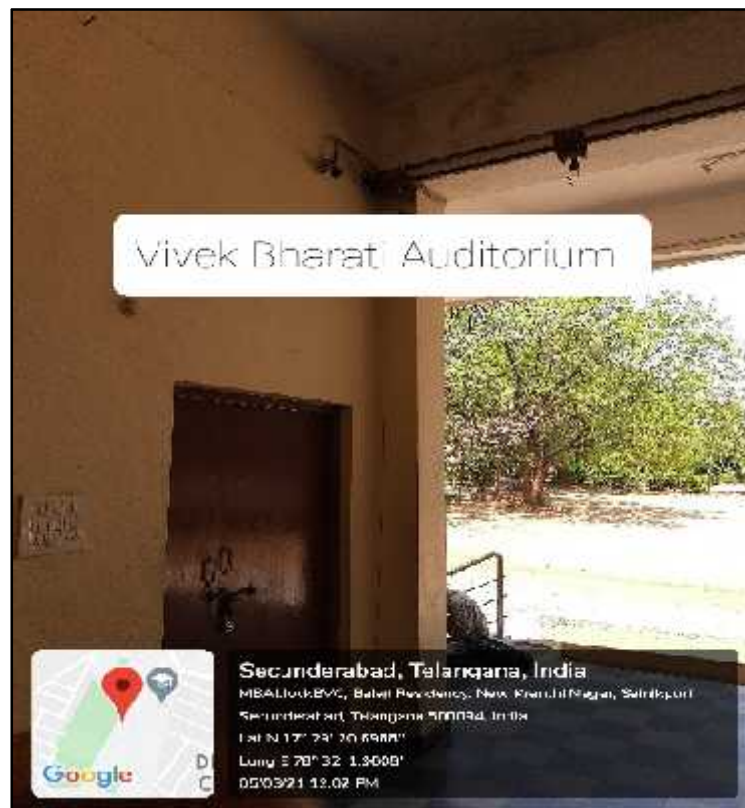

On the penultimate day i.e on 29th dec 2019, a singing activity which was taken up by the students. In the latter part of the day, a flash mob to spread the awareness about the orange day was taken up by enthusiastic students. Also there was a sale of orange ribbons and the money so collected was used for a social cause.

After being celebrated for a week the orange day celebrations have come to an end on 30th November, 2019 with a skit which was presented by a team of 15 students. The celebrations have been shaped into a grand success by a mass rally which started from the Swami Vivekananda statue till the Neredmet X road. 600 students from various units viz. 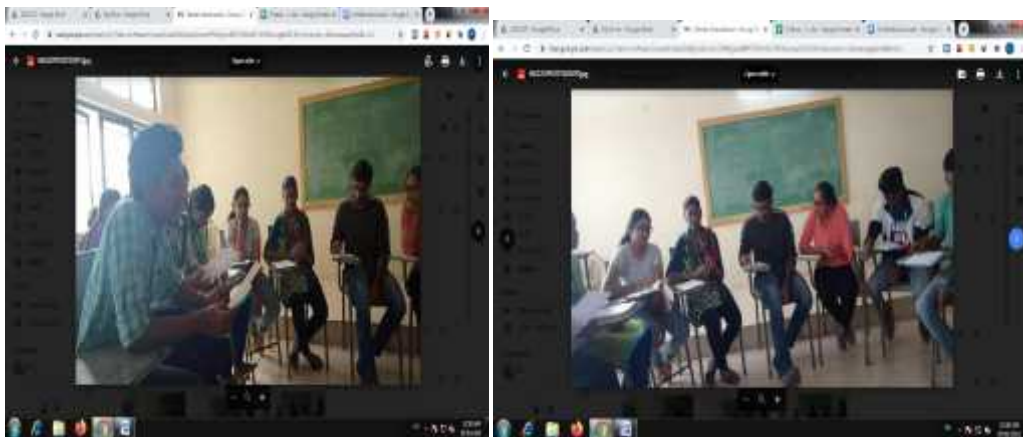


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Group Discussions on gender issues and women empowerment

By 1 all the activities will be complete after that the next session i.e., SPEAK UP will be started. The main aim of SPEAK UP is to make the girls only to speak in English for better communication where each and every student will take place in their session.

Day 2: On day 2 they learnt about great women like Poorna Malavath, Angelina Jolie, Mary Kom etc. What are the hurdles they faced in their life, family situations and how they overcame their hurdles and became successful in their lives.

Day 3: On day 3 counsellor taught campus about getting an education and courses available at Intermediate and PG level.

Day 4: On day 4 we taught that there are different ways to earn money such as scholarships, part time job etc and how to be independent.

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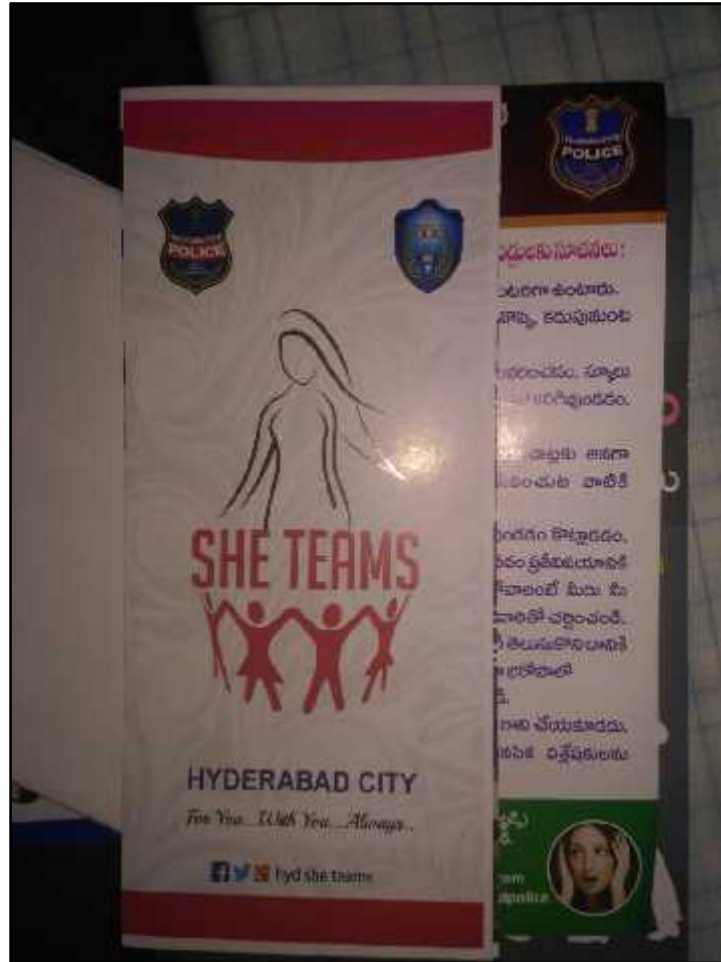

1. NCC cadets of 12/2 COMPANY, 2(T) BN NCC, SCEUNDERABAD GROUP, AP&T Directorate of Bhavan's Vivekananda College of science (BVC), Sainikpuri, has organised a cycle expedition on 17th, 18th and 19th of August 2017 to Yadagirigutta, YadadriBhuvanagiri Dist.

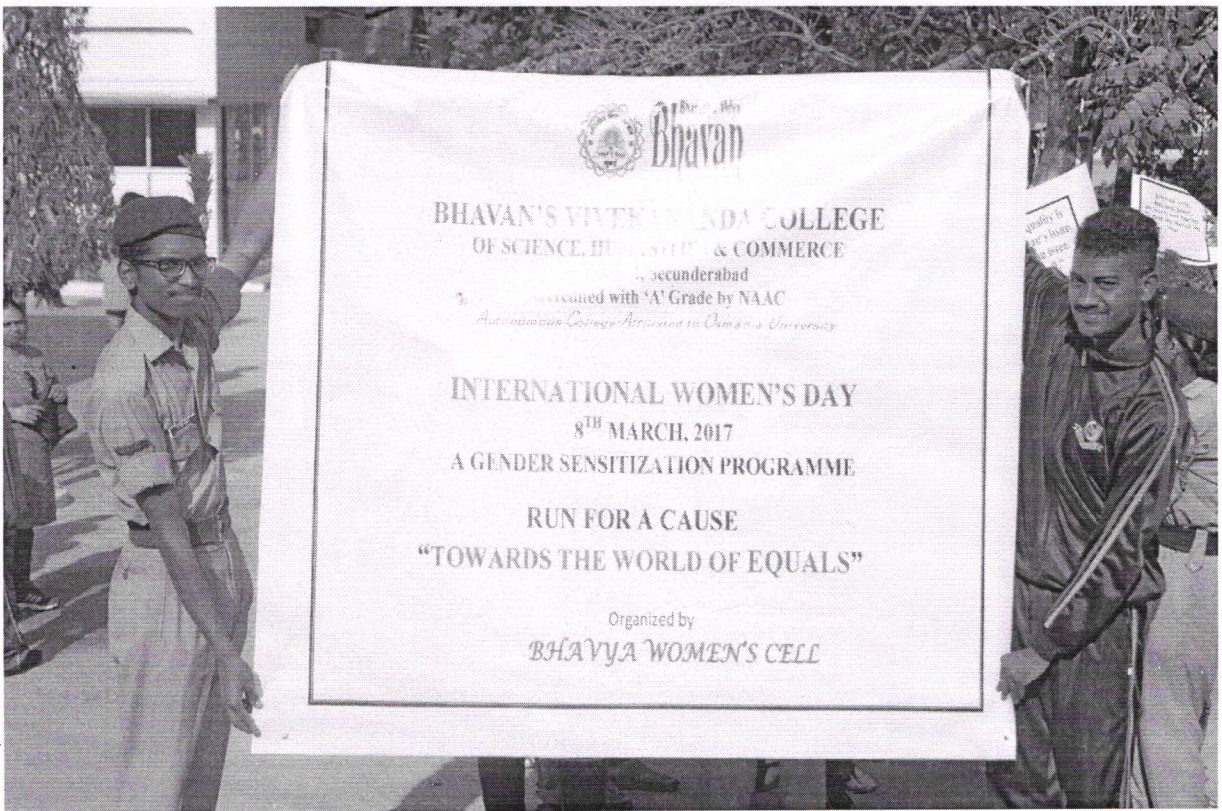
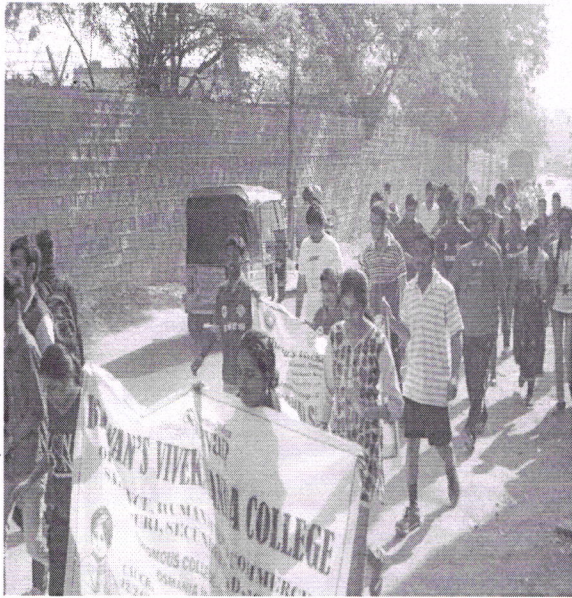

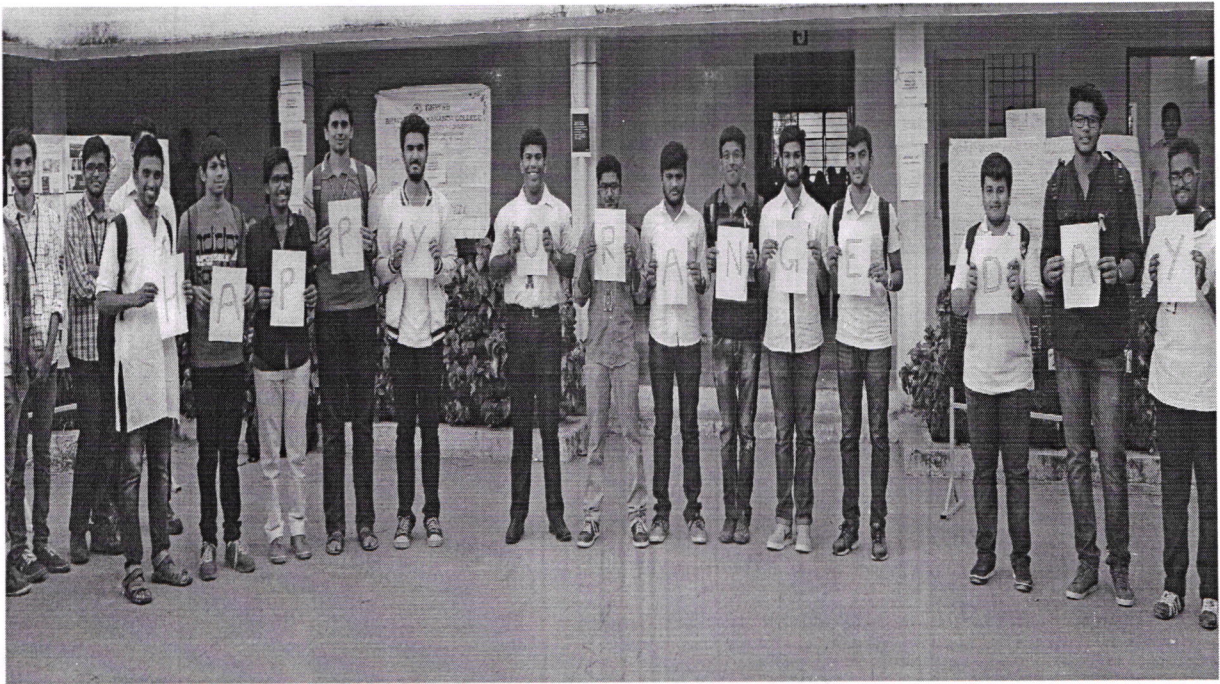
GENDER SENSITIZATION PROGRAMME - ORANGE DAY PROGRAMME

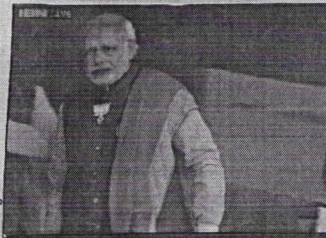

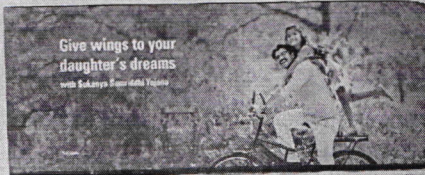

White Ribbon Day

Genesis – In 1989, on the afternoon of December 6, a student at the University of Montreal massacred 14 of his fellow female students. His actions traumatised a nation and brought the issue of violence against women to the forefront of our collective consciousness.

In response, a group of men in Toronto decided to speak out and work to stop men's violence against women. In 1991 they initiated a male-led movement known as White Ribbon, with an annual awareness-raising event (White Ribbon Day) held between 25 November and 6 December.

It is now an international effort in over 57 countries, of men and boys working to end violence against women.

Orange Day

The UN Secretary-General's UNiTE to End Violence against Women campaign, managed by UN Women, has proclaimed every 25th of the month as "Orange Day" – a day to take action to raise awareness and prevent violence against women and girls.

Initiated and led by the UNiTE campaign Global Youth Network, Orange Day calls upon activists, governments and UN partners to mobilize people and highlight issues relevant to preventing and ending violence against women and girls, not only once a year, on 25 November (International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women), but every month.

The date of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women also marks the start of the "16 Days of Activism" that precedes Human Rights Day on December 10 each year.

UN Member States agreed on the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development which recognizes the transformative power of women and girls. These goals include gender equality and women's empowerment as a key priority and includes specific targets to end violence against women and girls.

It is a known fact that the campaign would be successful by engaging men to make women's safety a man's issue too. If Men are speaking to other men about violence against women then it would be a powerful catalyst for change. The tools for men to stop violence against women in their community and beyond are through education, awareness raising, creative campaigns, preventative programs etc.

With this idea Orange day programme was initiated in Bhavan's Vivekananda college on 25th November 2016. Boys actively participated in sale of orange ribbons symbolizing their support for the cause to raise awareness and also prevent violence against women and girls.

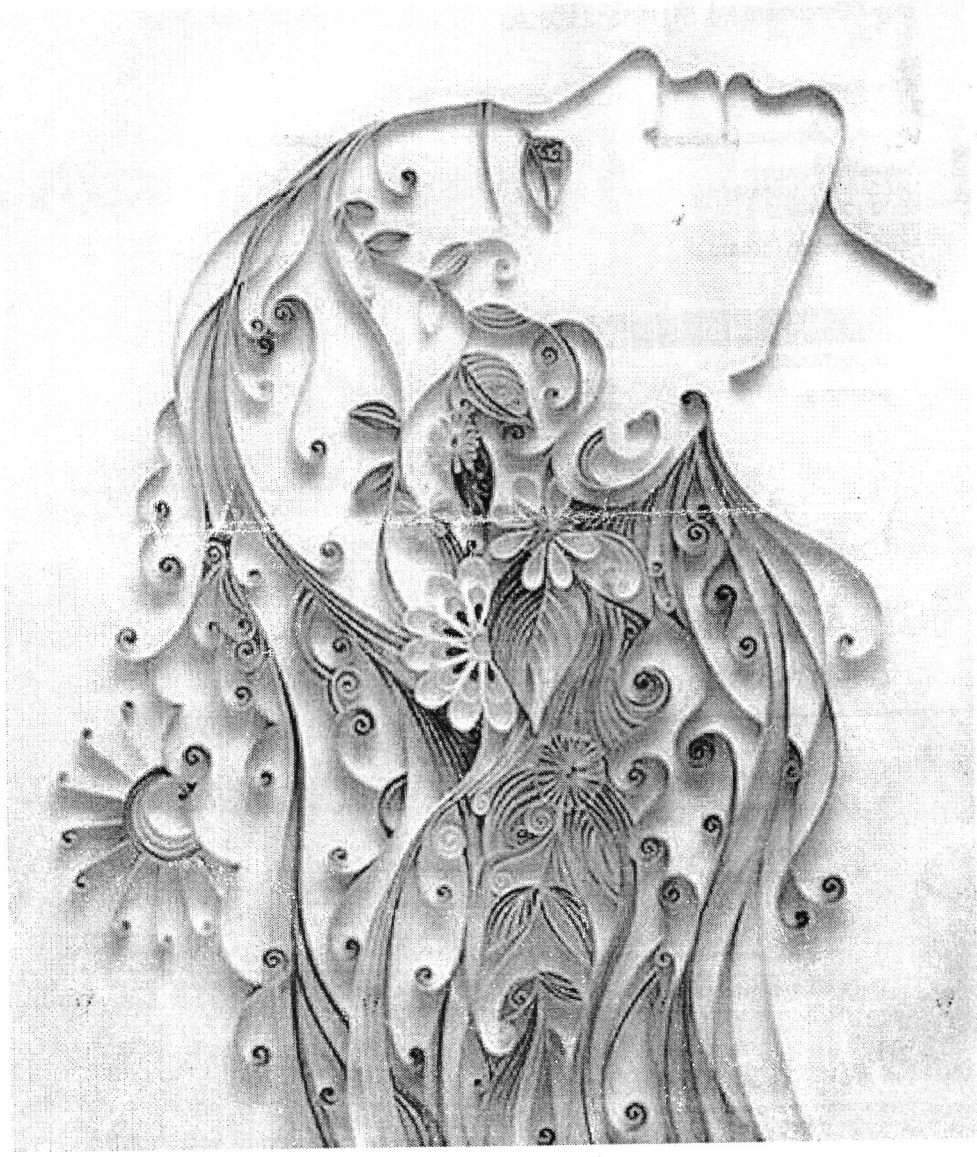
The same programme is planned to be extended to the corporate sector.

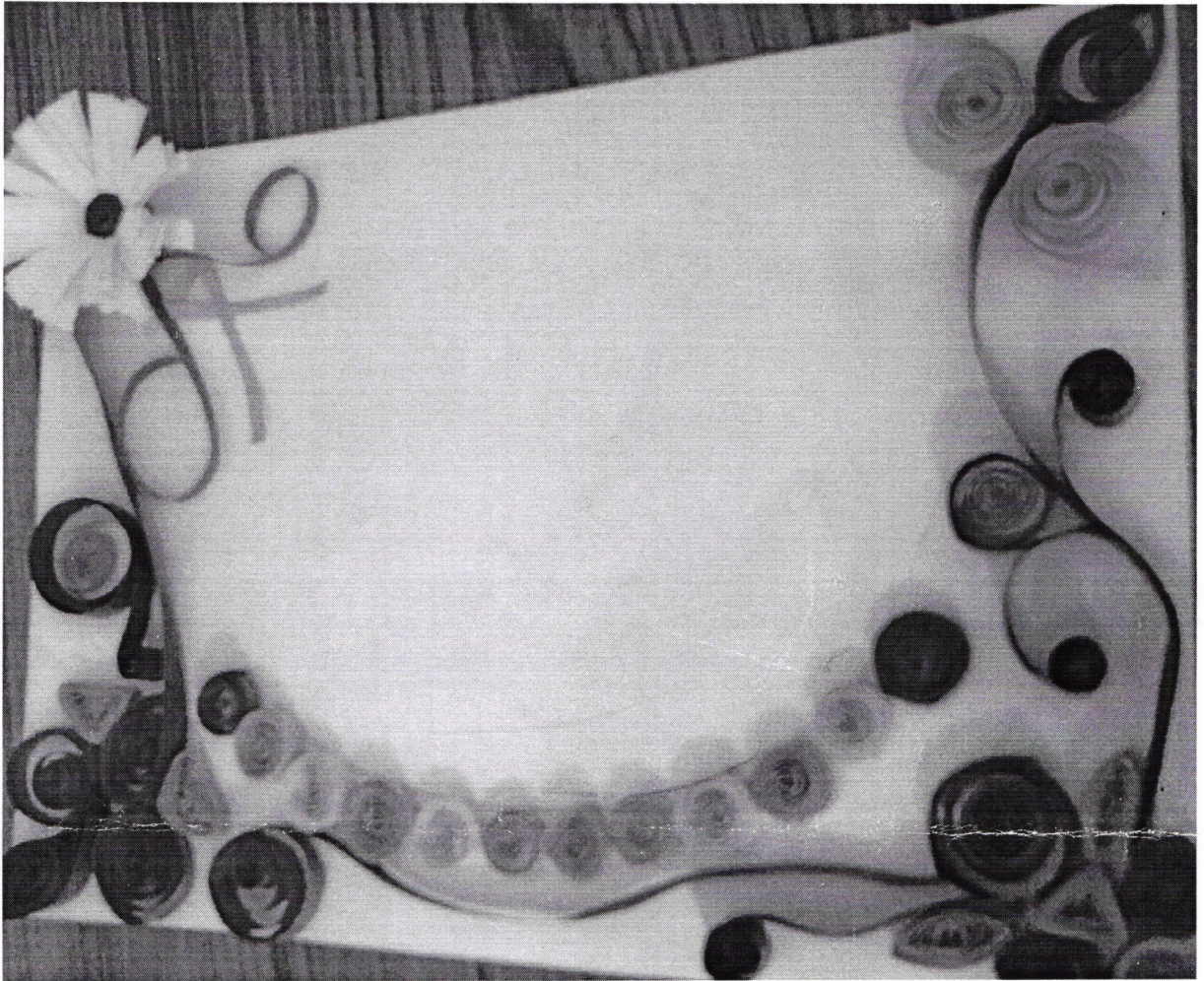

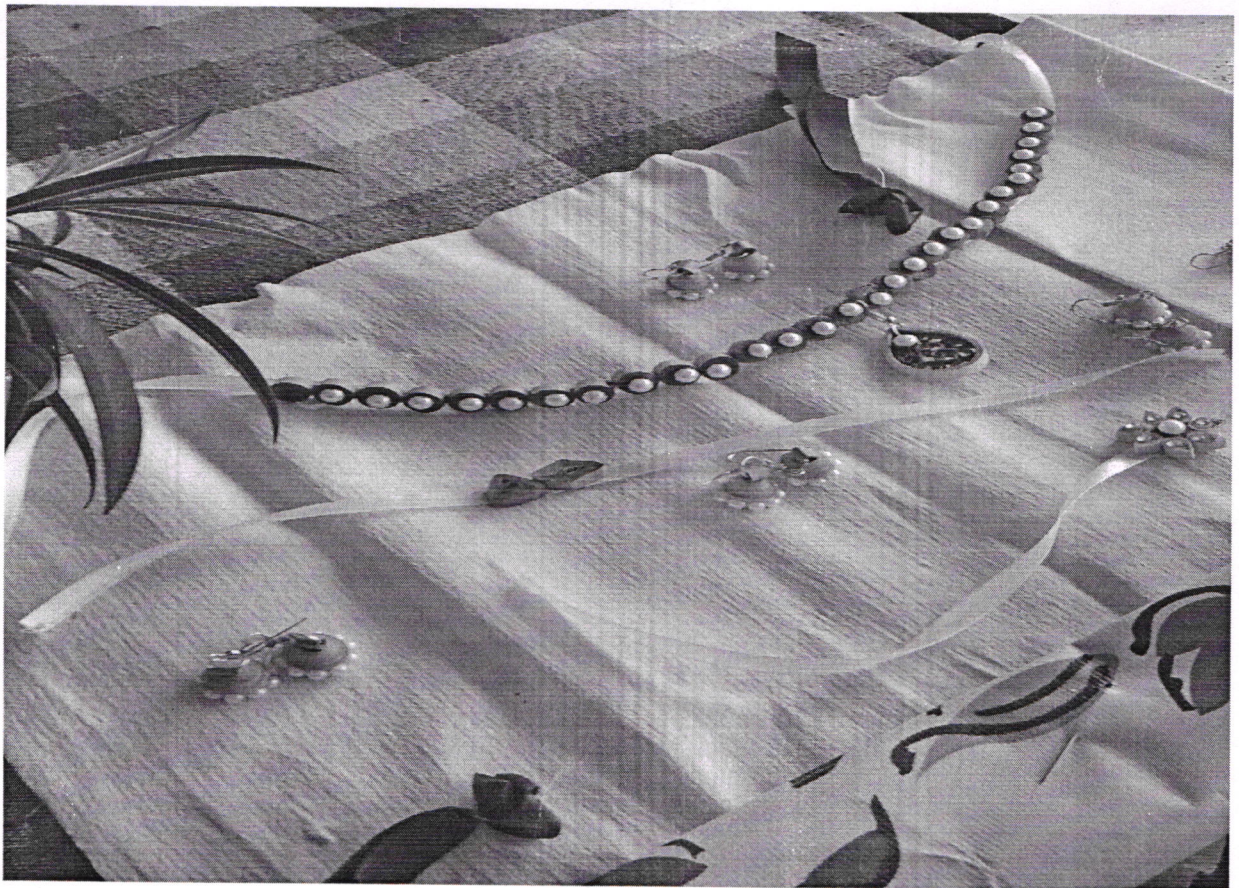

Science of Mehendi

- Henna scientifically named as *Lawsonia inermis* is also known as Henne, Al-Khanna, Al-henna, Jamaica Mignonette, Mendee, Egyptian Privet etc.
- It is a small shrub found in the hot climates of India, Pakistan, Malaysia, Persia, Syria, Egypt, Morocco, Sudan, and other North African, Asian, and Middle Eastern countries.
- The leaves of the henna plant contain a red-orange dye molecule, lawsone, which has an affinity for bonding with protein, and has been used to dye skin, hair, fingernails, leather, silk, and wool. Henna designs are usually drawn on the hands and feet, where the color will be darkest because the skin contains higher levels of keratin, a protein.
- Lawsone is primarily concentrated in the leaves, and is in the highest levels in the petioles of the leaf. The lawsone in the paste migrates into the outermost layer of the skin and makes a red-brown stain. Whole, unbroken henna leaves will not stain the skin; henna will not stain skin until the lawsone molecules are released from the henna leaf. Fresh henna leaves will stain the skin within moments if they are smashed with a mildly acidic liquid, but it is difficult to form intricate patterns from coarse crushed leaves.
- Soles and palms have the thickest layer of skin and so take up the most lawsone, and take it to the greatest depth, so that the palms of the hands and bottoms of the feet will have the darkest and most long-lasting stains.
- Henna is known to reduce the heat in the body.

- ✓ Wall paintings excavated at Akrotiri (dating prior to the eruption of Thera in 1680 B.C.E.) show women with markings consistent with henna on their nails, palms and soles.
- ✓ Many statuettes of young women dating between 1500 and 500 B.C.E. along the Mediterranean coastline have raised hands with markings consistent with henna.
- ✓ In the *Bible's Song of Songs* and *Song of Solomon*, henna is referred to as Camphire.
- ✓ Henna has been used to adorn young women's bodies as part of social and holiday celebrations since the late Bronze Age in the eastern Mediterranean.
- ✓ The word "henna" comes from the Arabic name Hina for *Lawsonia inermis*.
- ✓ Most popular in South Asia, the Middle East, North Africa, and Somaliland, as well as expatriate communities from these areas.
- ✓ It is theorized that dots of henna were first applied to the palms of the hands as a means of cooling down the body. Early users of henna began to add lines and other shapes to the single dot on the palm, eventually developing the elaborate designs used today.

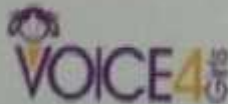


