A Gram Sabha Meeting Was conducted by the Gram Panchayat, Peerlaguda Village, Farooqnagar Mandal, Ranga Reddy District by BA students on 7th September, 2019 and the students witnessed the proceedings of Gram Sabha which included discussion on various issues and problems of village like Education, Road, Water and Health.

1. The Gram Sabha trip provided scope and exposure to the students about the functioning of the Panchayat Raj Institutions in exchange of ideas and interactions with people from villages.
2. During interaction with the representatives from the Gram Panchayat, the students briefed about the 73rd amendment of Panchayat Raj Act. It was informed that the PRI Act has enhanced the participation of the community in the development process of their villages and it emphasized on the participation of women and people belonging from the marginalized communities such as the Scheduled Caste (SC) and the Scheduled Tribe (ST).
3. The discussion on functioning of the Panchayat Raj Institutions and government contribution for the development of the village attracted students to know how these institutions independently worked at the grass root level.

4. The students understood that the government officials and political representatives needed to maintain transparency in maintaining financial transactions.
5. The students became aware about the career avenues at the village level and scope to initiate small and cottage industries relating to agricultural products.
6. The students created awareness for environmental issues and organised plantation program along with the representatives and people of the village.

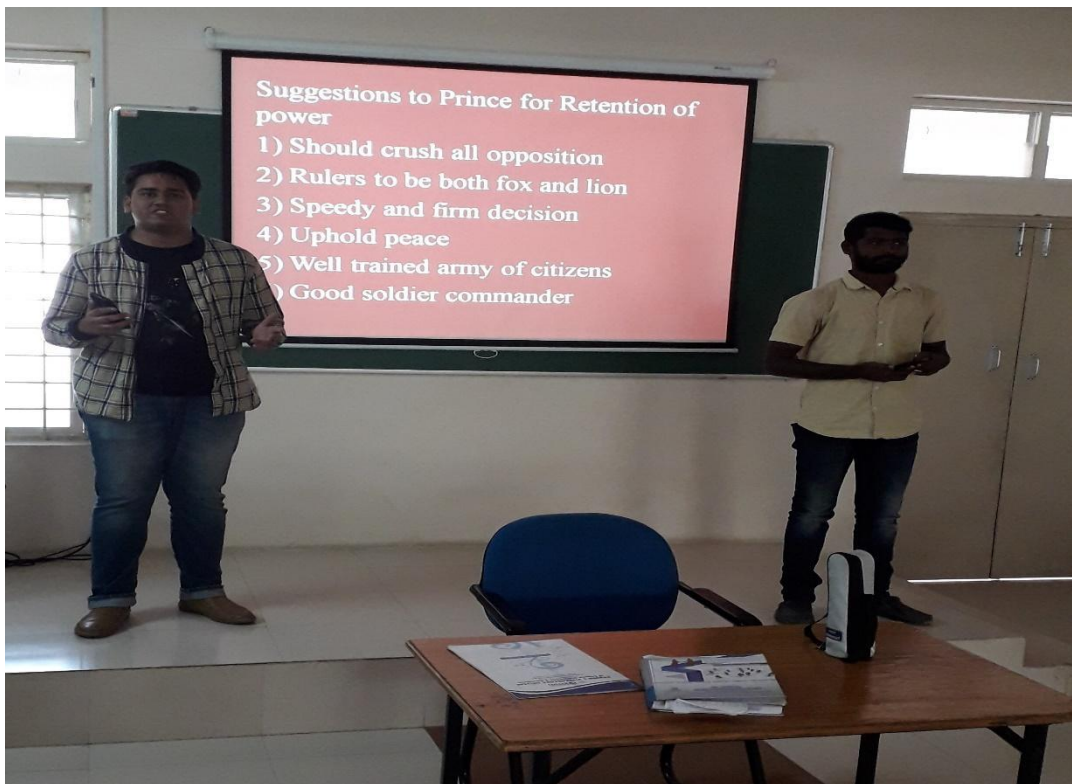

19th November, the first day of the tour was spent visiting the Aguada fort built by the then Portuguese rulers for providing fresh water supply to the ships passing by in the Arabian Sea. The evening was spent in Baga Beach relaxing and trying new water rides such as banana drift and parasailing. Students were excited for the second day of the trip as everybody received their delegate identity card. The other half of the day was spent visiting St. Francis Xavier's Church, Old Goa. The church is a part of the Churches and convents of Goa UNESCO World Heritage Site which hold the mortal remains of St. Francis Xavier. It was a learning experience for the students.

Finally it was time to sit back and enjoy the International Film Festival that all the students were eagerly waiting for. On 21st and 22nd of November students visited the Kala Academy and Inox Purvorium where they had the privilege to meet honourable celebrities such as Amitabh Bachan, Rajnikanth, famous producers and directors such as Shobu Yarlagadda, Eva Cools and many more.

The rest of the time was spent viewing various screenings of movies such as I am Woman, Bhuvan Shome, Deerskin The father, Thankless Job, Cleo and many more award winning movies. Evening was planned for a movie screening of a Konkani movie by the beach. After movies students were given time to explore the markets of Goa to shop for some Souvenirs to take back. Students enjoyed watching movies in various languages, witnessing different cultures through the movies and learning about variety of movies.

Effective Communication and Personality Development

The Department of Mass Communication had conducted a guest lecture on 'Effective Communication and Personality Development' on 27th September 2019. Ms. Aliza Virani, mentor, Suchitra Academy is the resource person. She spoke about the individual's mindset, about the exchange of thoughts, exchange of ideas, feelings, and emotions of different people with an emphasis on effective communication. She spoke on transactional analysis, aspects of ego states and types of transactions- parallel complimentary, crossed complimentary.



Guest Lecture on
'Challenges in Journalism'

The Department of Mass Communication had conducted a guest lecture on 'Challenges in Journalism' on 19th September 2019. Mr. D. Nagarjuna, a senior adviser to the Government Institute of Printing and Technology and a visiting faculty in few colleges in Hyderabad is the resource person. He worked in key roles in the industry of Printing and Publishing. His expertise in Editing and Writing for media is incommensurable. He has also worked as a senior copywriter in the Parliament of India.

He talked about the journey of news travelling from its source to the readers and also gave a detailed account of daily challenges of journalists. He explained that there are three main stages to the development of a news story. First is the job of reporters, second are the editors, third is the printing process.

The students got an understanding that a journalist's job is very hectic and requires them to be available round the clock. They have to be very attentive to the details and also have to get their work done before the deadline. He said "the main challenges of a journalist include: getting rejected, the pressure of deadlines, prioritize their schedules, adjustments to make, last minute changes, social media and fake news." The session was concluded with a question and answer session.



Visit to Shadnagar - Gram Sabha

The soch club of Faculty of BA organised a trip to an interior village in shadnagar, Rangareddy district on 7th september 2019. The BA students, accompanied by their lecturers visited peerlaguda village in shadnagar and witnessed the 'Gram sabha' meeting of the villagers.

Mr. Mohd. Mobeen the sarpanch of the village, addressed the villagers and enquired about their problems and came up with remedies to rectify them. As a part of it, the students also conducted an outreach programme where the children of the local school were taught how to work the camera and were awarded on their performance. Also, a small skit about the importance of 'small savings' "was also performed by the students for the villagers. Overall, the trip was a grand success helped the students to uncover a new dimension of the society.





Human Resource – The Sleeping Giant in India

Department of Economics, Faculty of BA had organized a guest lecture by Mr. Raghunandan Vadla, author of the book 'The Great Indian Treasure', on *Human Resource - The Sleeping Giant in India* on 7th August 2019. The speaker referred to Dr A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, and said Development is not about economic development, GDP, but it is about human values development. He also mentioned that conventional way of searching jobs should end as there is a mismatch between the demand and supply of jobs. The speaker told that the country is not just land but its 'people' are the real treasure. Talents, Capabilities, Passion, Strength are the core factors to make the world a better place. Students showed lot of enthusiasm in answering the questions during the interactive session.



Sakshi News Channel Visit

The students of BA had visited the Sakshi news channel located in Banjara Hills on 22nd July 2019. The students got exposed to the entire broadcasting process in the news channel. The entire structure of the news channel is divided into three major sections namely Input, Output and the social media section. The students were divided into three groups and each group were taken to all the departments of the channel separately. Students had also eye witnessed the live broadcasting session in the studio. Mr. Srinath, the output editor of the news channel had guided the entire team. Students got an enriching experience in visiting the channel.



“India’s Border and Internal Security Management” – Maroof Raza

The event was an interactive session with the very known Mr Maroof Raza, retired Indian army officer with experience in counter insurgency operations. It was conducted by Confederation of Indian Industry with the label of Yi interactive session. The venue for it was Radison Blue Hotel, Banjara Hills. The timings set for the event was from 5:30PM to 8:00PM.

Around 6:30PM, A crowd of 100-150 people had gathered in the hall. In the beginning we were shown a small video on the surgical strikes that were conducted recently. We then got along with the spokesperson Mr Maroof Raza who had started of his one hour lecture with the topic, “India’s Border and International Security Management”. As we were listening to his insights, we had our awareness shift to the various accounts and detailed records of the events that were occurring in our Indian Defence Systems. These detailed records covered various topics like “China helping Pakistan”, “Threats from North West neighbours of India”, “India’s limited resources in the field of battle”, “Sino-Pak boundary issues”, “Maoist threats”, “Insurgency and terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir”, “Insurgency in India’s North East states”, “Threats at urban cities in India”. After the lecture, there was a question and answer session where the audience was given an opportunity to ask questions from Mr Maroof Raza. Questions imposed on him brought out new subjects to the play, which included “Relations with Srilanka”, “Abolishment of Article 370” and many more. Finally the lecture cum interactive session had come to an end and we were shown a few clips on Organ donation to spread awareness and take part in acts which can contribute to it. The session was very interesting and by the end of it, we had a profound understanding of the various aspects of the Indian defence systems with a flavour of Mr Maroof Raza’s opinion on each subject.



Movie Outing

The Department of Mass Communication, Faculty of BA had organized a movie outing on 6th July 2019 accompanied by the Dr. Seema Ghosh, Coordinator, BA and Mr. Shiva Thrishul, Lecturer, Mass Communication. The team watched the movie, Article 15 which focussed on the main idea of the implementation of Article 15 of the constitution. Around 15 students from BA1, BA2 and BA3 had participated in this movie outing activity. The movie concentrated on the problems of the Dalits in rural areas and the gruesome caste discrimination that happens on a regular basis. This movie outing caters the students needs in both Mass Communication and Political Science disciplines. The students and the faculty reached the venue, Cinepolis, Malkajgiri by 2:00pm and enjoyed the first movie outing activity of the Department.

PANEL DISCUSSION ON BUDGET 2020-21

On 1st February, 2020 the Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitaraman presented the Union Budget of India for the financial year 2020-21. A budget is an estimation of revenue and expenses over specified future period of time and is usually compiled and reevaluated on a periodic basis. In a country with deep cultural, religious and economic diversity such as India, it is extremely important for the government to allocate resources wisely. Therefore, a well-planned budget is of utmost importance for any government to ensure economic stability and growth. To encourage the youth to gain more insight about the budget, the Department of Economics, Faculty of Arts organized a panel discussion on 'BUDGET 2020-21'. The discussion was held on 7th of February 2020 for the students of the Bachelor of Arts. Prof. M. Usha, Chairperson Andhra Mahila Sabha, Mr. Ganesh Narwade , trainer CA& CS and Mr. Rahul Rojanala, practicing CA were the panelists for the day. The various aspects of the proposed budget were analysed along with the key issues like fiscal deficit, skill development and those concerned with the unorganized sector. This initiative by the Department of Economics helped the students more socially aware about the financial affairs relating to the economy of the nation.



Industrial Visit to Narmul Mother Dairy

Industrial visit was organized by the Department of Economics. Faculty of BA to **Narmul Mother Dairy Plant** for the final year students on 11th of January 2020. Dr. Seema Ghosh and Mr. Shiva Trishul accompanied the students for the visit. The main objective of this visit was to witness the processing of the Mother Dairy Products in the unit and gain some insights through the process. Mother Dairy product range includes milk, curd, butter, ice-creams, Badam milk, ghee, Doodh Peda and others.

The Nalgonda- Ranga Reddy Milk Producers Mutually Aided Coop.Union Ltd. (NARMUL) is a registered Cooperative manufacturing unit. The Union is having 20 Milk Units in Nalgonda , Yadadri-Bhongir, Suryapet districts and 4 in Ranga Reddy and Vikarabad district and one feed mixing plant is situated at Bhongir so as to supply cattle feed to the farmers of the Five districts.

The students were explained about the hygiene and quality that is maintained throughout the production. They witnessed the process of making dhoodh peda, packaging of milk and the test laboratory which keeps a check on the products from time to time. Students also learnt about the distribution economical activities relating to the production. It was a practical learning experience for the students.



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
