Day 5: Nov 7, 2020


Time: 2.00 p.m. - 4.30 pm.

Dr C Kameswari Head,Dept of Languages read the valedictory report of the five-day FDP programme.The program concluded with vote of thanks.























Report on Guest Lecture – English

The Department of Languages conducted a guest lecture in English on the 28th of October 2020. The resource person - Dr Grace Sunita Didla, Assistant Professor, Department of Phonetics, English and Foreign Languages University, Hyderabad, spoke on the topic - Introduction to Phonetics in English, introducing the students of semester I to the 44 sounds in English and their pronunciation. Dr Grace made the session very interesting by involving the science behind the articulation of sounds by the human mouth and how the different parts of the mouth are used in producing each sound. later, she walked the students through a series of slides that helped them to identify the correct pronunciation of many words in English. The session was very interactive and ended with many students requesting for more such sessions.


Report on Guest Lecture - French

Conducted on: 25-09-2020


The Department of Languages conducted an online guest lecture in Hindi on Friday, 25th September 2020, using Microsoft Teams. The resource person was Mr. Rajendra Prasad Verma and the topic for the Guest lecture was " Role of Mobile and Computer in daily work and Indian Language Advanced Information Technology". Around 100 students and faculty members of the Department of Languages attended the lecture.

Mr. Rajendra Prasad Verma is Assistant Director, Hindi Teaching Scheme, Department of Official Languages, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, Pune Maharashtra.

In his lecture he spoke about Hindi Computer Typing and Hindi Stenography in Unicode as well as various software development tools, Hindi to English, providing information on translation software, dictation in state language, Hindi dictation software, exploratory state language etc., presentation of tool development and introduction of how to use it.

The lecture given by the Chief Guest in the webinar was very informative for all the teachers as well as students. Dr. C. Kameswari, Head, Department of Languages, shared that it was a great experience to be a part of such an informative and helpful session and more sessions of such kind would definitely change the way of working from hard work to smart work. The lecture ended with a vote of thanks







He mainly spoke on the ten main concepts through which the culture of any nation would be reflected in. They are: History of the country, politics of the country, language, literature, religion, philosophy, arts, sciences, society and the great men who wrote the history of the country.

He cited three important ways of speaking to children that would have a better impact. Teaching children through parables, as they relate to them and understand their morals in a better way. To imbibe Indian culture and its values into the tender minds, he suggested to collect relevant value-based audio and video clips and present to them at regular intervals. He also suggested to take up case studies based on values. The sacrifices made by the parents for their up bringing should also be narrated to

them at regular intervals. Parents as role models should be able to improve their quality and they should be benefitted by them.

Post Lunch

Mr. Sravan Kumar, Principal of New Era Junior College, Narayanguda spoke on Social responsibilities, values and culture. He presented the problems, mannerism and facts of the present generation in a very simple language and gave live examples. He as a Principal is concerned about the welfare of the students but every day becomes challenging to him. While explaining the difference between 'Guru' and 'Upadhyaya', he navigated us through the culture, ethics and moral values of our country. He expressed his unhappiness that Indian culture has unfortunately taken a backseat now. He said that, the parents and teachers need to change, they have to be patient enough with their lads and teach them with utmost love and care. One needs to be devoted towards their duties.

Concluding session

In the concluding session Swamy Bodmayanandji asked the teachers to share their experiences on the two day faculty development program. Faculty members from BSAJC and BVC expressed their happiness and shared their views. They expressed their gratitude and gave their impressions and also gave few suggestions for better practices of teaching history and culture to the students during the last few minutes of every class. There was also a suggestion to decentralize Swamy Vivekananda's teachings so that it is accessible for all those who are interested in attending the sessions on a more regular basis.

Swamiji also gave information about the future courses going to be offered exclusively for the girl students. He informed about the Special programs going to be organized at R.K.Math for different age groups during July and August.

The faculty was enriched with the program and felt that more such programs be organized on regular basis which will enhance their teachings skills and they would try to inculcate them into their class room teaching.

He explained in detail on enhancing the quality of higher education through the perspective of NAAC. The speaker for the second session was Prof. Ramabramham(HCU). He spoke on MOOCs. He gave a detailed explanation about MOOCs, its availability of the online course and its utility in the students' fraternity. After both the sessions there was a break for lunch. After lunch, we had the third session. The speaker was Dr. Saswathi Choudhary (St. Francis Degree College For Women). She spoke on NAAC – Challenges and issues in Reaccreditation. She elaborated on the 'Need for varied combinations of the courses offered in India to optionally equip the students for international placements.' The fourth and final session was taken by Prof. P.S.N Reddy (Retd. Professor OU). He spoke on the 'Role of a good teacher.' He elaborated on how teaching can be made more effective and interesting. He spoke on the role of a teacher as a mediator to convey the knowledge to the students. He explained the process by the stating the Howard's Multiple Intelligence theory. It was a very interesting and interactive session. The day ended on a very encouraging, insightful and motivating note.

The Faculty development Program on the 3rd of June 2017 was a one day program at Rama Krishna Math. The faculty was to report by 9:30a.m at Rama Krishna

Math. It started with the breakfast at 10:00a.m after which we had a session led by Swami Bhodmayanandji. He spoke about the 'Need for the spiritual consciousness through meditation, to have a control over our minds which will enhance the teaching – learning process.' After that we had the second session, where the faculty was divided into two groups and there were two sessions held simultaneously in two different rooms. The speakers were Dr. Vivek Modi and Mr. Srinivas respectively. Dr. Vivek Modi spoke on 'How to improve our teaching skills by using simple traditional methods.' Mr. Srinivas spoke on 'How teachers employ innovative methods to motivate the slow learners and even the demotivated ones.' The groups were switched after both the sessions. Then we broke for lunch. After that we had a session by Mr. Praveen on the 'Psychology of students.' The final session was a skype call with Mr. Srinivasan from Mumbai. He spoke regarding 'The advancements in teaching methodology.' It was an interesting interactive session. The day was closed with the views and feedbacks shared by the faculty members.

Dr.Y. Aparna faculty member from the Department of Microbiology compered the programme. With the blessings of the almighty the program started.

Prof Y Ashok – Principal, BVC welcomed the gathering. He congratulated both the faculty and the students for the results. He discussed in brief on the status of the autonomy of the college. He motivated all the faculty to be vigilant and ready to face the challenges. He gave an insight into the teacher–student relationship.

Dr. Y. Aparna welcomed the eminent speaker Dr. Pannala Ramaiah with an inspiring sloka.

Dr. PannalaRamaiah - spoke on the topic - `Quality in Higher Education – perspective – NAAC.

He opined that knowledge can be acquired in three ways: one should be a voracious reader, should be a good observer, be a good traveler. He recollected that in 1993, a three member committee for NAAC was appointed and he was one of the nominees. NAAC was established in the year 1994. He differentiated between the terms assessment and accreditation.

In depth he spoke about the different Stages of Assessment :Sustainable Stage, Competitive Stage, Innovative Stage, Quality Stage (Premiere Stage)

He also categorized the Premiere Institutions as - Institutions of National Importance and Institutions of International Institutions. Quantity (Increased Access), Quality (Relevance and Excellence) are the reasons for accreditation.

He also said that there are seven steps in quality:

Q – Quest for excellence

U – Understanding

A – Action-oriented

L – Learner Centric

I – Innovation

T – Training

Y - Yearly Progression

A good teacher engages in Teaching, Research and Extension. The best practice of an institution is to internalize and institutionalize.

He also gave a detailed insight of the Seven Criteria of Assessment and Accreditation: Curricular aspect, Curriculum design and development, Curriculum planning and assessment, Feedback system, Student profile, Evaluation process, Research consultation and publication. He said that the institution should have facilities which are - Innovational, Institutional, Identification, Internalize, Designates and also should have definite question which pose the strengths and weaknesses of the institution.

Prof Y Ashok in his presentation gave a small report on themilestones of the last five years, list of awards by faculty members, new initiatives taken in the last five years. He also insisted that the **IQAC** of the college was taking measures to enhance the Quality sustenance for the last five years, suggestions and role of the institution, was of high priority. The number of meetings held in the last five years were also discussed and he also said that the minutes of the meetings were maintained. He proudly said that there were visible changes in teaching and learning system.

Prof. Rama Brahmam: gave an insight of MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses)

He discussed in depth on - ideal teaching and Flip teaching.

He tried to put MOOCs in a Nut-Shell and gave his opinion on - existing teaching and learning methods, we need to think - What is new ?, the philosophy of MOOCs, where it all began?, its relevance in India. He also spoke about SWAYAM (Indian version), advantages and challenges of MOOCs. Speaking on the **Philosophy of MOOCs, he said that it is —** Anytime, Anywhere, Anyone

He said that MOOCs is very relevant in India because of the Urban rural disparity, unavailability of teachers, its demographic limitations.

SWAYAM is the Indian version of MOOCs. It is an EPG patashala, where 75 subjects have been identified.

Morning Session (10.00-1.00 pm)

- 1. Principal, Prof Y Ashok gave the welcome address.
- Chairman, BVC, Dr. Y Bhaskar Rao addressed the gathering. He said, since ancient times, India has always given the highest importance to Education. He stressed the need for research and innovation in the field of Education to produce knowledgeable and skilled youth.
- 3. Vice Chairman, BVC Sastry, addressed the gathering. He said that autonomy is a responsibility and it should be taken up as a challenge by the institution.
- 4. Hon Director, BVC Col M Vijay Rao also spoke on the occasion.

9-12-2019

Rhyme Time was conducted in English, Telugu and Hindi on 10th December. Students were asked to choose a minimum of 3 words from the 8 given to write poetry in their preferred language. 28 students took part in the event.











11-12-2019

Spellathon was conducted in 3 rounds on 11th December. Round 1 was based on vocabulary, in which the participants were supposed to solve crossword puzzles and unscramble the given words. 30 teams consisting of 2 members each participated in it. Round 2 was Spell Bee, where the students were supposed to write the spellings of 30 words in 15 minutes. Round 3 was Pictionary, in which a team member was supposed to convey to the other person, the meaning of a given word through drawing.







Sanskrit-Word Building and Idioms & Phrases and French singing "Le Rosignol" were conducted on 12th December. 7 teams of students participated in the French singing event. There were solo and group performances. The judges for the event were Ms. Prasitha Haridev, Department of Languages and Ms. Shanti Priya, Department of Mathematics. Word Building and Idioms and Phrases were also conducted on 12th December. In the Sanskrit Word Building event, students were given a cue word using which they were supposed to create a chain of words. In the recitation of Idioms & Phrases, students were given one minute time to recite as many Sanskrit Idioms & Phrases as possible, flawlessly. 8 students participated inWord Building and 6 students participated in recitation of Idioms and Phrases.























The last event of the series was "Making a story out of newspaper cuttings", which was conducted on 13th December. Students were supposed to create a story using the newspaper cuttings in one hour"s time. English, Hindi and Telugu were the language options given. 20 students participated in teams of 2 each.
