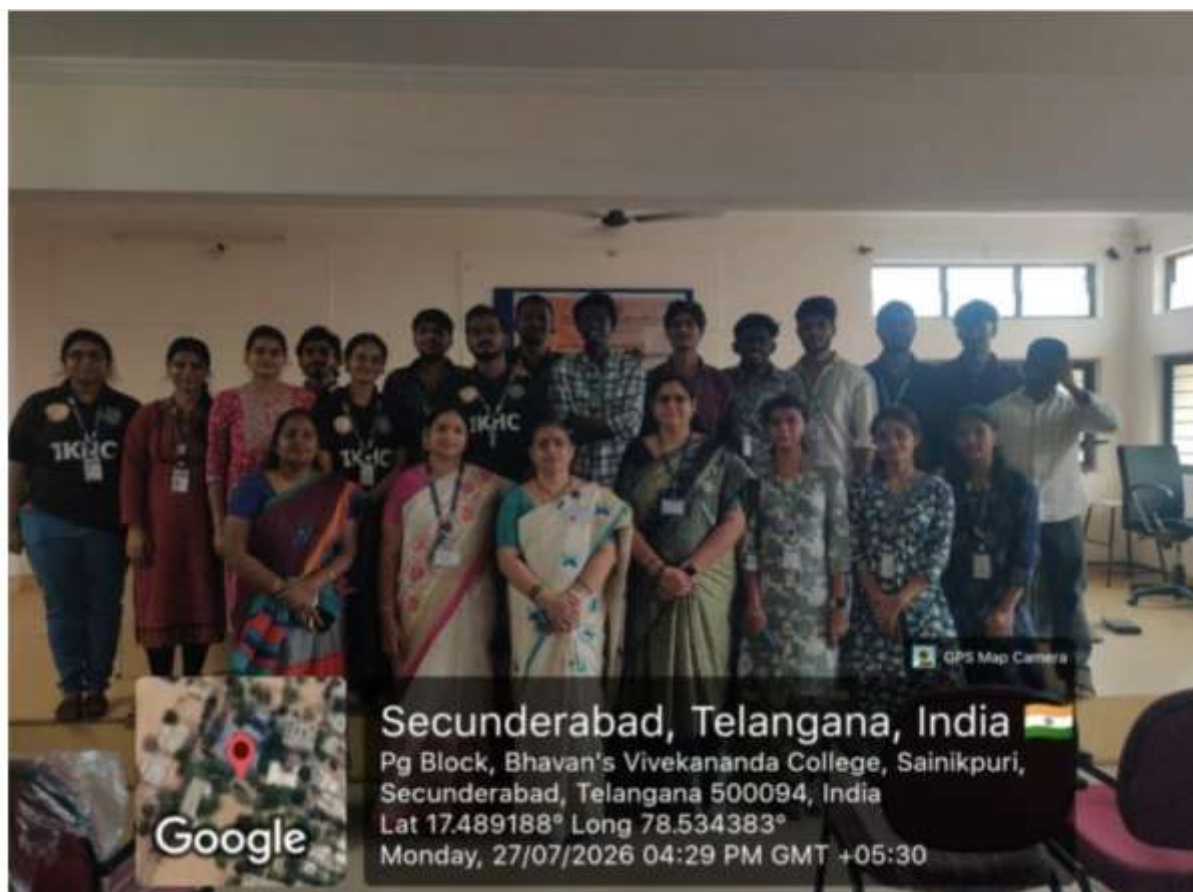
EVENT: GURU QUEST – 27 July, 2026
