c). As per the vision of NEP-2020, the college is offering flexible and innovative curricula. Choice based credit system is being followed in the college for all UG and PG programs offered in the college. Interdisciplinary projects were offered to the students as part of DBT STAR College scheme to attain holistic and multidisciplinary education. Also Projects were integrated as credit giving courses for award of degree at undergraduate and post graduate level

(d). IQAC of the college organized a National seminar on NEP to provide awareness and exercise on multiple entry and exit options. Also it encouraged the faculty to participate in various hands on training, workshops and seminars to exercise on Multiple Entry and Exit Programs(MEEP) proposed by NEP.

(e). The institution takes lead by promoting Multidisciplinary approach in view of NEP 2020. It promoted interdepartmental research and the evidence of success is measured in terms of various interdisciplinary paper publications and Patent publications in the past two years. All science departments offered interdisciplinary research projects to students.

(f). Offering of GE and AECC courses as interdepartmental courses is a good practice adopted by College. Introduction of Skill Enhancement Course to all programs offered is in alignment of NEP. Also introduction of professional ethics, IPR and Patenting, Research ethics in curriculum and conduct of various Value added courses are the good practices followed by the institution.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institution introduced MOOCs online courses through National Schemes like NPTEL for all Postgraduate programs offered in college and credits were transferred for award of degree.

The college is in the process of registering in Academic Bank of Credits which is an important feature in NEP 2020.

Being an Autonomous college with choice based credit system, the faculty members are encouraged to design their own curricular and pedagogical approaches in alignment with parent university following the UGC norms. The college follows a systematic examination pattern approved by Statutory bodies for both continuous internal assessment and semester end examination.

17.Skill development:

The College is in the process of designing the Credit Framework for implementing NEP-2020

(a). The institution offers Soft skills certification programmes as an augmentation to the curriculum through Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the college which enhances the knowledge, skills and aptitude of the students. Placement cell of the college conducts Campus Recruitment Training(CRT classes) to prepare students for attending various internship and placement interviews which is in alignment with National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF).

(b). Various Skill enhancement courses are being offered in the college. BVC facilitates various Internship programs, On Job training, Personality development programs, hands on training, certificate programs to develop workplace related skills and attitudes to students. The institution has MoU's with National institutes like NSIC, IICT, NSE, Institute of Genetics etc which collaborate to provide various laboratory and Entrepreneurship skills to students. ED cell of BVC in association with MSME, India fosters in developing entrepreneurship skills to students

(c). BVC imparts value based education amongst learners by student participation in various NCC, NSS,BSG and Outreach programs organized. Women cell, Centre for Excellence cell and Green campus program and various scholastic clubs in the college conducts sensitization programs to inculcate ethics, morals, values, Scientific temper, environmental consciousness and Life skills to students.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college strives to integrate Indian Knowledge System into the teaching learning system by adopting various means of delivery. The curriculum offers Indian languages like Hindi, Telugu and Sanskrit as second language course for offering degree with credits

Also the college conducts language day celebrations to encourage and inspire the students towards languages like Telugu, Sanskrit and Hindi. Various activities like Guest lectures, Seminars are organized with eminent resource persons. The college library gives an enriching experience through various collections of books on ancient history and culture. BVC has rare collection of "Talapatras" and "Grandhas" to promote Sanskrit and vernacular Language system. The computers have "Baraha software" installed to deliver online mode of teaching during COVID pandemic times. To promote culture, various commemorative days like Independance Day, Republic day, Teachers Day, Youth day, Yoga Day etc are celebrated. To uphold the cultural diversity, various regional and national festivals are celebrated.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The College has followed Outcome Based Education since 2017 and there is a mechanism to measure COs, PSOs and Pos. the College adopts PDCA (Plan, Do, Check, Action) model for Outcome Based Education.

Plan: Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes, Course Outcomes.

Do: Preparation of Academic Organizer, Planning of teaching methods and teaching aids. Check: Assessments, Continuous Internal Assessment, Semester End Examinations, Seminars, Quizzes, Assignments.

Action: Continuous Improvement, Revision of Curriculum, Change of teaching methodology

The College conducts attainment analysis of course/programme since it helps in mid-course adjustments/improvement of curriculum, teaching-learning methods, teaching resource requirement, assessment methods and reliability of evaluation procedures. Each CO is mapped to POs/PSOs using CO-PO Matrix with a correlation between CO and POs/PSOs on a scale of 1 to 3 in ascending order -3 being the highest, 2 being moderate and 1 being the lowest. Correlation between the average of all COs and POs/PSOs is determined for each course. This gives the CO target value. Course-PO matrix is obtained by mapping the average course outcome of each course across all semesters of the programme to POs/PSOs. The average values for all the courses against each PO give the PO target values. Course attainment level is measured at the end of the semester for each course. Programme attainment level is measured after completion of a graduate programme. The Programme Matrix is derived from the Course-PO mapping value and the Course Outcome attainment value for each course. The average of these values for all courses across all semesters gives the PO attainment. The gap between PO attainment and

PO target is analysed for curriculum redesigning of the programme

20.Distance education/online education:

The College was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and the subsequent National lockdown just when the semester-end examinations had begun in March 2020. The IQAC immediately designed strategies, systems, structures and methodologies for switching over completely online teaching and assessment. An effective 'Learning Management System (LMS)' was brought in place for technology integration, in virtual methods of teaching, evaluation and scaling and an interoperable digital infrastructure base was developed. The faculty members were trained on various platforms for online teaching, e-learning and evaluation; the students were advised on the use of gadgets; the efficacy of online teaching was evaluated and methods were standardized based on the feedback. These efforts paved the way for smooth conduct of classes and examinations during the academic year 2020-21. During pandemic time the college teaching is a blend of the conventional 'chalk and duster' method and technology driven online method. Blended learning was introduced by inclusion of online courses from MOOCs in the curriculum. The College library is now fully automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) to envelop a host of activities that include: 1.Acquisition 2.Cataloguing 3.Serial Control 4.Bar-coding of books 5.Circulation of books 6.0PAC (Online Public Access Catalogue)

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution's research facilities are frequently updated and there is a well-defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

Research Consultancy and Extension Cell (RCEC) functions to implement the research policy of the college for improving the quality of research. RCEC was reconstituted in the year 2021.

The college was granted Rs. 17.6 lakhs fund under DBT STAR College scheme for strengthening undergraduate research and training programmes. One Faculty member from Microbiology department was sanctioned a research fund of Rs.0.45 lakhs/annum by UGC DAE-CSR. The college invited proposals for Minor Research Project from the faculty members for promotion of research. 13 proposals were received and were screened by a Panel of Research Advisory members; 11 project proposals were shortlisted with Rs.4.8 lakhs as the seed money.

Research publications of the college include 23research papers inScopus/Web of Science Journals, 14 patent publications, 3 research paper presentations in International conferences, 12 textbooks and 9book chapters. Three faculty members were awarded Doctoral degrees. Students from all streams were encouraged to take up short term research projects and a total of 760 projects were completed. Academic consultancy services were offered to MSME centre, Department of Mathematics and Institute of Genetics of OU by the faculty members of the college.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

The college is located in a sprawling 10-acre campus; its teaching and supporting departments are accommodated in seven separate buildings with a total built up area of 13757 sq.mts. The college has 63 classrooms with Wi-Fi, 32 Laboratories, a Computer Centre, 3 Research Labs, a Common Instrumentation Facility, a Library, 2 Seminar Halls, 3 Auditoriums, a Media Centre, a Poly house etc. to facilitate teaching-learning. An additional floor in the new block is under construction.

The computer labs are renovated and equipped with new computers to cater to the needs of technology augmented learning. Computers are installed with necessary licensed software/open source software. All the laboratories are spacious, adequately equipped and well maintained.

The facilities in the Media Centre include a Studio and an Editing suite; the Studio is fully sound-proof, equipped with industry standard lighting and green matte for recording lecture videos, interviews, podcasts, audio recording and production of radio programmes, television shows and news bulletins.

Media Centre with Studio and Editing suite: Fully sound-proof studio equipped with industry standard lighting and green matte has been set up for recording lecture videos, interviews, podcasts, audio recording and production of radio programmes, television shows and news bulletins.

• Liquid waste:

Liquid waste from laboratories and drains are channelized to GHMC drainage on way to sewerage treatment plant. Distillation unit outlet water is reused on cooling and Sullage from canteen is directed for watering plants.

RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS AND EXTENSION

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution's research facilities are frequently updated and there is a well-defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

Research Consultancy and Extension Cell (RCEC) functions to implement the research policy of the college for improving the quality of research. RCEC was reconstituted in the year 2021.

The college was granted Rs. 17.6 lakhs fund under DBT STAR College scheme for strengthening undergraduate research and training programmes. One Faculty member from Microbiology department was sanctioned a research fund of Rs.0.45 lakhs/annum by UGC DAE-CSR. The college invited proposals for Minor Research Project from the faculty members for promotion of research. 13 proposals were received and were screened by a Panel of Research Advisory members; 11 project proposals were shortlisted with Rs.4.8 lakhs as the seed money.

Research publications of the college include 23research papers inScopus/Web of Science Journals, 14 patent publications, 3 research paper presentations in International conferences, 12 textbooks and 9book chapters. Three faculty members were awarded Doctoral degrees. Students from all streams were encouraged to take up short term research projects and a total of 760 projects were completed. Academic consultancy services were offered to MSME centre, Department of Mathematics and Institute of Genetics of OU by the faculty members of the college.

The college is located in a sprawling 10-acre campus; its teaching and supporting departments are accommodated in seven separate buildings with a total built up area of 13757 sq.mts. The college has 63 classrooms with Wi-Fi, 32 Laboratories, a Computer Centre, 3 Research Labs, a Common Instrumentation Facility, a Library, 2 Seminar Halls, 3 Auditoriums, a Media Centre, a Poly house etc. to facilitate teaching-learning. An additional floor in the new block is under construction.

The computer labs are renovated and equipped with new computers to cater to the needs of technology augmented learning. Computers are installed with necessary licensed software/open source software. All the laboratories are spacious, adequately equipped and well maintained.

The facilities in the Media Centre include a Studio and an Editing suite; the Studio is fully sound-proof, equipped with industry standard lighting and green matte for recording lecture videos, interviews, podcasts, audio recording and production of radio programmes, television shows and news bulletins.

• Solidwaste:

Solid Waste is segregated: leaf litter being biodegradable goes into vermicompost pit and wet waste is collected by GHMC. Recycling of waste paper is done annually as part of MoU with ITC. Incinerators are available in ladies rest rooms. Discouraging/reducing the use of plastic at canteen.

• Liquid waste:

Liquid waste from laboratories and drains are channelized to GHMC drainage on way to sewerage treatment plant. Distillation unit outlet water is reused on cooling and Sullage from canteen is directed for watering plants.

• Biomedical waste:

Good lab practices include handling and disposal of biomedical waste. The laboratories are disinfected regularly.

• e-Waste:

Written-off e-wastes are collected from all departments and sent for Repurpose and those retained are reused.

• Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste:

Laboratory analysis involving radioactive material is strictly refused in curriculum due to the risks involved.
