Round 1: [Kaboom \(Discover the joy of unveiling\)](#)

The present round, framed and presented by Vighnesh Naidu, was placed on the famous platform Quiz.com. 21 teams enrolled and presented themselves in a competitive mood showcasing their enthusiasm and willingness to test their knowledge. In the course of the round, a certain number of teams were eliminated depending on their performances.

Guidelines:

- A team must have 2 or 3 members.
- Questions will be based on general knowledge and current affairs.
- Each team will have only 1 phone to take part in this round, if more than one phone is used the team will get disqualified.
- Eliminations of team will start from 1st round itself.



Round 2: [Knock Knock, What's wrong \(spot, correct and conquer\)](#)

This round was introduced and expertly hosted by Jyotsna and Ishtiaq. The theme of the round, "Spot, Correct, and Conquer," encouraged participants to quickly identify mistakes or inaccuracies, correct them, and demonstrate their knowledge to conquer the challenge. This format added a thrilling edge to the competition, as teams had to stay sharp. The combination of problem-solving and speed made the round exciting and engaging for both the participants and the audience.

Guidelines:

- A team must have 2 or 3 members.
- Each team will be given 20 seconds to analyse the image, which contains subtle or obvious errors.
- No external aids are allowed (phones, books, or internet access)
- 10 points will be granted for successfully identifying and correcting the mistake.
- Accuracy and relevance of corrections will be judged by the moderators.



Round 3: [The Outcome Oracle\(Trust Your Instincts\)](#)

This round was introduced by Snigdha and was hosted by Vighnesh and Snigdha. The focus of the round 'Trust Your Instinct's centered on the instinct and decision of the participants in the round. The round started with 7 teams which were all set up to exhibit their wisdom and their instincts of the game. Subsequently, as the contest matured, they needed to go through specific rounds which required them to be active in their instincts and their decision making. The combination of strategy, confidence and quick thinking made this round fun and the outcome of it unpredictable.

Guidelines:

- A team must have 2 or 3 members.
- short clip showing an experiment's setup will be shown.
- The video will be paused just before the outcome, and 4 options will be displayed.
- The time limit to answer the correct option will be 20 seconds.
- Correct answers will earn 10 points.
